
BOARD OF ALDER HISTORY

Board of Alderpeople

Functions

- Create, amend, and pass city ordinances
- Approve city budget

- Each ward represented by one alderperson elected by the ward.
- 4 year terms
- Half of the board is up for reelection every 2 years

Function

- Presides over Board meetings
- Appoints committees
- Serves on all committees
- Determines bill committee assignments

- Elected by the entire city
- 4 year terms











CITY – COUNTY DIVIDE

Offices appointed by Mayor



Ward Reduction


2012:

- Ward redistricting was completed by December 31, 2021


2023: First election with reduced wards

REDUCED WARD MAP




A New Redistricting Process
